#### **RELIGION NEWS**

The season of Lent is one that affords us all the opportunity to renew our commitment to the Lord and to living up to the standard that He calls us to as His sons and daughters. The seasonal disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving help us to recenter and focus our lives on what truly matters.

While these disciplines are being daily taught in the classroom, our school family also wants to provide an opportunity to live them out. For the next several weeks, we have sought to incorporate opportunities to pray and to give alms into our schedule here at school.

Prayer: During the Lenten season, adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will be available each Tuesday (except for March 2nd) at Our Lady Seat of Wisdom Chapel on Notre Dame's Campus. From 7am-3pm, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for adoration and prayer for members of the Notre Dame community, and our extended family, friends, and alumni. All are welcome to come and pray with us at your convenience and for any amount of time. Hour time slots have been filled to ensure that there will always be someone present during this time of prayer and a special thanks to Mrs. Brenda Boulet for organizing the schedule ensuring that all hours are covered. Come and pray with us!

Almsgiving: Each year, Notre Dame works to raise funds to build a home in Haiti through the "Hearts for Haiti" program. To date, we have been able to build more homes than any other entity participating in the program throughout the United States. For around \$6000, we are able to build a home for a family in need, provide education materials and tuition for the children in the family, job training for the parents, provide a small patch of land and a farm animal to help them to become semi self-sufficient and provide a continual income.

Each Tuesday during Lent is "Wear a Red Shirt" day for our Hearts of Haiti fundraiser. Students are able to wear any red t-shirt (or any 'Hearts for Haiti' shirt, regardless of color) for \$1. All proceeds go towards building a home in Haiti.

If you are a student, we want to encourage you to participate in the fundraiser, with your dollar serving as alms for the poor. If you are interested in helping out with this endeavour and would like to financially contribute to help us reach our goal, you can send a check to school, made out to "Notre Dame High School" and by writing "Hearts for Haiti" in the memo line.

We pray that this season, filled with prayer, fasting, and almsgiving would be one of great spiritual growth in each of our lives! That we would daily be led closer and closer to the Cross of Christ and the Tomb of His Resurrection.




