# message from the ADMINISTRATORS

August 30, 2021

Dear Notre Dame Family and Friends,

August with its heat, afternoon showers and the first weeks of school, is almost over. It brought the Senior Retreat, announcement of the Homecoming Court, volleyball and football scrimmages/games and the longing for a touch of cooler weather! Thank you to Father Brent Smith, James Franke, and our faculty/admininistration who were involved in the Senior retreat. It was a time for sharing, affirmation and prayer for all those involved. The education of a child requires active teamwork between the family and the school. These past 15 months have both tested, and strengthened, the bonds that hold us together. ACT.org

Hands down, experts agree that the best free prep option is the content on the official ACT website. Sample questions, sample student essays and college admissions planning advice are just some of the many helpful materials available on this website.

Khan Academy https://www.khanacademy.org/

While it is officially an SAT prep site, the math review lessons available for free on this website can be helpful for the ACT too — especially if you need to get up to speed on the subjects covered on the math portion: algebra, geometry and trigonometry.

ACTStudent

Available for iPhone, this free app created by the makers of the ACT helps you prepare with practice items, scores and feedback to answers. A link to the ACT's mobile site offers answers to FAQs about the test.

#### How should students handle getting stumped by a question during the test?

Always use the process of elimination to try to give yourself a greater chance of getting the question correct if you need to guess. If you truly have no idea how to do a question, cut it loose and keep moving. Don't stress too much or let it consume too much of your time. You can star it in your test booklet and plan to come back later — that's if you have extra time at the end. For these skips, you should always bubble-in a letter on your Scantron in case you don't have time to return. This will also prevent you from getting off a letter.

#### How should students prep the night before test day?

Students should take the night before the test off to rest and relax a bit before the big exam. We typically recommend that students do a little review the day before, but it should be cut off by around 4 p.m. If you haven't learned it by then, it likely won't be terribly helpful.

Sleep and hydration are two of the most important considerations the night before the test. Your brain will be much more effective on test day if you regulate your sleep three to five days before, but better late than never. Similarly, staying hydrated leading into the test and during it will help students remain focused for a greater length of time.

#### And just like that, it's September!

I hope and pray that you've all had as good of a start to the school year as we have. Our Campus Ministry program is getting up and running, our Seniors had an amazing retreat to begin the school year, and there's just so much more to look forward to in the coming months.

One exciting thing that we will be starting this year was briefly introduced in this past summer's newsletter. We are excited to announce that we will be participating, as a school community, in the Diocesan Vocations Prayer Cross ministry. This ministry is to encourage families to pray together for an increase in vocations in the Diocese of Lafayette and in the Universal Church. Each week, a slot will be open for a family to take home the Prayer Cross kit and to pray for vocations.

You do not need to have a current student enrolled at Notre Dame in order to sign up to take the kit home to pray. The kit includes a Vocations Cross, a small statue of Our Lady painted by religious sisters in Lafayette, and an easy-to-follow prayer booklet to use while praying together as a family for an increase in vocations.

If you sign up to have the Vocations Prayer Cross Kit for one school week, it will be sent home with your student (if you have one) or can be picked up yourself on Monday of the week for which you sign up. You can return the Vocations Prayer Cross Kit the Friday of your chosen week either by sending it back to school with your student or dropping it off at the Religion Office before 3 pm.




