COUNSELOR'S CORNER

Study Habits of Highly Effective Students

The key to becoming an effective student is learning how to study smarter, not harder. While some students are able to breeze through school with minimal effort, this is the exception. The vast majority of successful students achieve success by developing and applying effective study habits. Here's how.

1. Don't attempt to cram all your studying into one session.

Many students admit to finding themselves up late at night expending more energy trying to keep their eyelids open than studying. Successful students typically space their work out over shorter periods of time and avoid cramming all the work into just one session. Learn to be consistent in your studies and have regular, yet shorter, study periods.

2. Plan your study time.

Schedule specific times throughout the week when you are going to study- and then stick to your schedule. Consistency is key to developing good study habits. Even if you are caught up with your studies, creating a routine, where you set aside a period of time a few days a week to review your courses will help you develop these good habits.

3. Study at the same time.

Again, consistency is key here. Work to develop a consistent, daily study routine. When you study at the same time each day, studying will become a regular part of your life. Unexpected events do occur at times and that's ok. However, get back on your routine as soon as you can.

4. Have a goal for each study session.

Simply studying without direction is not effective. Before you start studying, set a study session goal that supports your academic goal (i.e. learn 20 vocabulary words in order to perform well on my next test)

5. Never procrastinate your planned study session.

It is extremely common for students to put off a study session because of a lack of interest in a subject, because the subject is hard, or simply because they would rather play video games or visit with friends. Successful students have something in common. They DO NOT procrastinate studying. Doing so leads to less effective studying and the tendency to cram.

6. Start with the most difficult subject first.

Students have a tendency to avoid difficult subjects because they require the most effort and mental energy. This is precisely why they should start with them first. Once you've completed the most difficult work, it is easier to complete the rest of your work. Believe it or not, attacking the difficult subjects first will greatly improve the effectiveness of your study sessions.

7. Try to avoid distractions while you study.

Distractions are everywhere...phones, TV's, you name it. During study students lose their focus and train of thought. Try to find a place to study free of distractions. It's best to study sitting up at a desk or table. Never study lying down on a bed or sofa as it triggers sleep.

8. Use study groups effectively.

Ever heard the phrase "two heads are better than one?" This can be especially true when it comes to studying. Studying in groups is something that I often recommend to our students. Working in groups enables you to 1) get help from others when you're struggling to understand a concept, 2) complete assignments more quickly, and 3) helps others and yourself process the material better. However, study groups are counterproductive if students are unprepared, unmotivated or lack focus. So you should select your study partners carefully.

I hope and pray that you've all had as good of a start to the school year as we have. Our Campus Ministry program is getting up and running, our Seniors had a great retreat to begin the school year, and there's just so much more to look forward to in the coming months.

We are excited to announce that we will again be participating, as a school community, in the Diocesan Vocations Prayer Cross ministry. This ministry is to encourage families to pray together for an increase in vocations in the Diocese of Lafayette and in the Universal Church. Each week, a slot will be open for a family to take home the Prayer Cross kit and to pray for vocations.

You do not need to have a current student enrolled at Notre Dame in order to sign up to take the kit home to pray. The kit includes a Vocations Cross, a small statue of Our Lady painted by religious sisters in Lafayette, and an easy-to-follow prayer booklet to use while praying together as a family for an increase in vocations.

If you sign up to have the Vocations Prayer Cross Kit for one school week, it will be sent home with your student (if you have one) or can be picked up yourself on Monday of the week for which you sign up. You can return the Vocations Prayer Cross Kit the Friday of your chosen week either by sending it back to school with your student or dropping it off at the Religion Office before 3 pm.
