message from the ADMINISTRATORS

Dear NDHS Family and Friends,

January has come to an end and we are into the 3rd nine weeks of school. Colder temperatures and rainy days mean that students are more closed- in than in better weather. We continue to stress that students remain home if they have fever, vomiting, pink/running eyes-- or active signs of transmissible illness. Please remember to call or email us if your student will be absent from school and if the illness is three (3) consecutive days or more, they can be documented as 'extenuating' if your student returns with a medical excuse. This helps preserve their 15 allowed absences for the school year.

Catholic Schools Week is being celebrated starting on Sunday, January 29th, and this is a wonderful time to thank God for the blessings of Catholic education. This is an opportunity to reflect on what NDHS has meant in our lives and in the lives of our families. In today's climate, we should not, and cannot, take this blessing for granted! We are grateful for our students, our parents and our faculty and staff; all working together to help Notre Dame High School of Acadia Parish continue its tradition of excellence.

On Friday, we will welcome our special guests, our Grandparents to celebrate the Liturgy with us! After Mass, we will be announcing our Supporter of the Year and our Teacher of the Year. St. Michael School has graciously agreed to allow any of our grandparents who have a conflict with their Faith Rally to attend on Thursday if desired, or to come from their campus to ours on Friday at 11:30 for our liturgy. Please join us! Immediately following our celebration, we will dismiss all our students so as to allow for lunch/time with their grandparents. Enjoy!

As you reflect on the importance of Catholic Schools, please be aware that financial viability is key to our future. We are immensely grateful to our parents and supporters for all their hard work for the DROP The MIC fundraiser earlier this fall. Initiated and implemented by parents; led by Claire Kelbaugh and her 'team', the fundraiser garnered \$43,000 to be paid on the loan for the East Wing renovations. A \$50,000 payment on this loan brings the balance to \$750,000. This is a perfect example of the way in which our stakeholders can have a tremendous positive impact on OUR school. Thank you!!!!!

In preparation for advising for the 2023-2024 school year, faculty members will meet the afternoon of February 3rd to begin the preparatory work on each student's advising packet. They will look at current progress (grades) and progress toward graduation, calculate a TOPS gpa, check ACT or standardized test scores, and confirm necessary core classes for next year. In the latter part of February, you will receive a call to schedule an appointment for Monday, March 13th. This is the time set aside for each student, and parent, to have an individualized meeting with their teacher-advisor and to make schedule requests for next year. Since our return to a traditional 7 period schedule, there are fewer decisions to make that aren't already pre-determined by graduation requirements. However, the information regarding TOPS, potential DE and student progress is still vitally important. Please let us know how we can better meet the needs of your student/s.

We ask for your continued support and prayers for Notre Dame and our Mission and wish you a Happy Catholic Schools Week!

FAFSA Deadlines

Completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) form is required for TOPS eligibility and also allows you to be considered for federal student aid. In addition, states and colleges use FAFSA information to award their own grants, scholarships, and loans.

Federal FAFSA Deadlines
2023–24 Academic Year
The FAFSA form must be submitted by 11:59pm
Central time (CT) on June 30, 2023.
